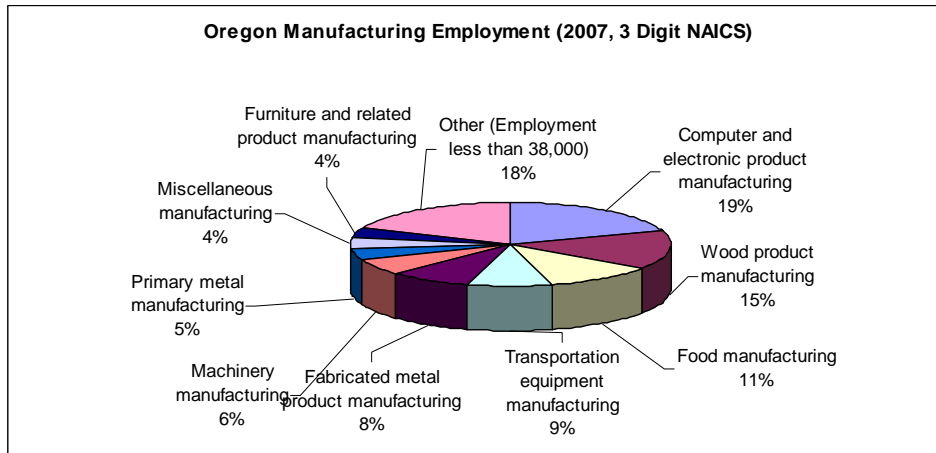


MANUFACTURING EMPLOYMENT IN OREGON

- Computer and Electronic Products, Wood Products, and Food Manufacturing account for almost half (46%) of Oregon's private sector, manufacturing employment (203,242).



- Manufacturing employment is concentrated in a small number of counties. Multnomah, Washington, Lane, and Clackamas counties' manufacturing employment accounts for approximately 61% of the state total.
- Average wages in the manufacturing sector vary widely across counties, ranging from \$75,817 in Washington County to \$25,307 in Wallowa County. The average manufacturing sector wage in Oregon is \$51,723.

- Oregon's manufacturing employment as a share of total private sector employment remains higher than the California, Washington, or US share of private sector, manufacturing employment.
- Manufacturing's share of private sector employment in Oregon has steadily declined from over 16% in 2000 to less than 14% in 2008.
